RULES

Competition to start at 8 a.m. (approx.).

Any Competitor not present at his scheduled time as intimated will be Disqualified.

In the County Competition, only One Entry will be accepted from each Competitor.

In the Open Competition, Two Entries will be accepted from each Competitor, but if a Competitor has a Dog entered in the County Competition he will be allowed to enter only One Dog in the Open Competition.

Dogs must be led and no Dog, unless entered, will be allowed on the Ground. Also no Bitch in Season will be allowed on the Ground.

The Committee and Judge will have full power to determine what work the Dogs must do.

The Judge will be at liberty to Stop a Dog at any point of his Trial, and his decision in all cases is Final.

The Time Limit from Sight to Pen will be indicated by the Judge before the Trials begin. All Dogs will be Stopped at expiry of Time Limit.

Three Sheep will be run for Each Dog.

The Number of Prize-winners in the County Competition who are eligible to compete in the Open Competition will be left to the discretion of the Judge. Points won in the County Competition will be carried forward to the Open Competition.

No Unauthorised Person allowed on Course during Trials.

While the Order of the Programme will be adhered to as far as possible, the right to run any Dog at any time is reserved to the Association.
