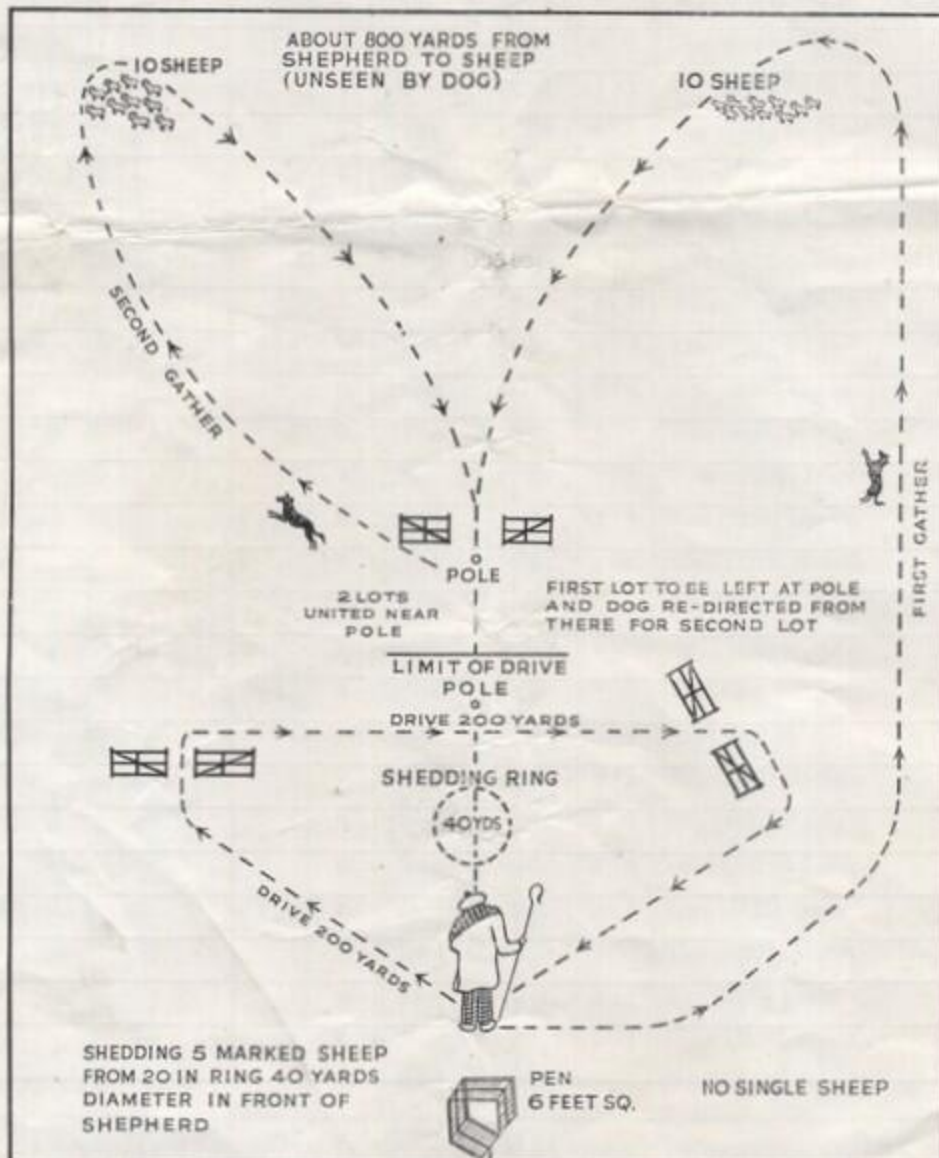

Championship Course (See Rule 43)

- Gathering.** Two lots each of 10 sheep to be gathered, one lot at a time and brought through the gates where they will be joined and brought to the handler. The first outrun may be to the right or left as the committee decide, and the second outrun to the other side. Any failure to negotiate gates, or other mistakes, will involve loss of points in the judges' discretion.
- Driving.** The twenty sheep to be driven approx. 600 yards in a triangular direction through two sets of gates. Failure to negotiate gates or other mistakes will involve loss of points in the judges' discretion. Drive ends when the sheep enter the shedding ring.
- Shedding.** Twenty sheep to pass between shepherd and dog, and the DOG to stop and turn back the five marked sheep.
- Penning.** Five marked sheep which have been shed off to be penned.

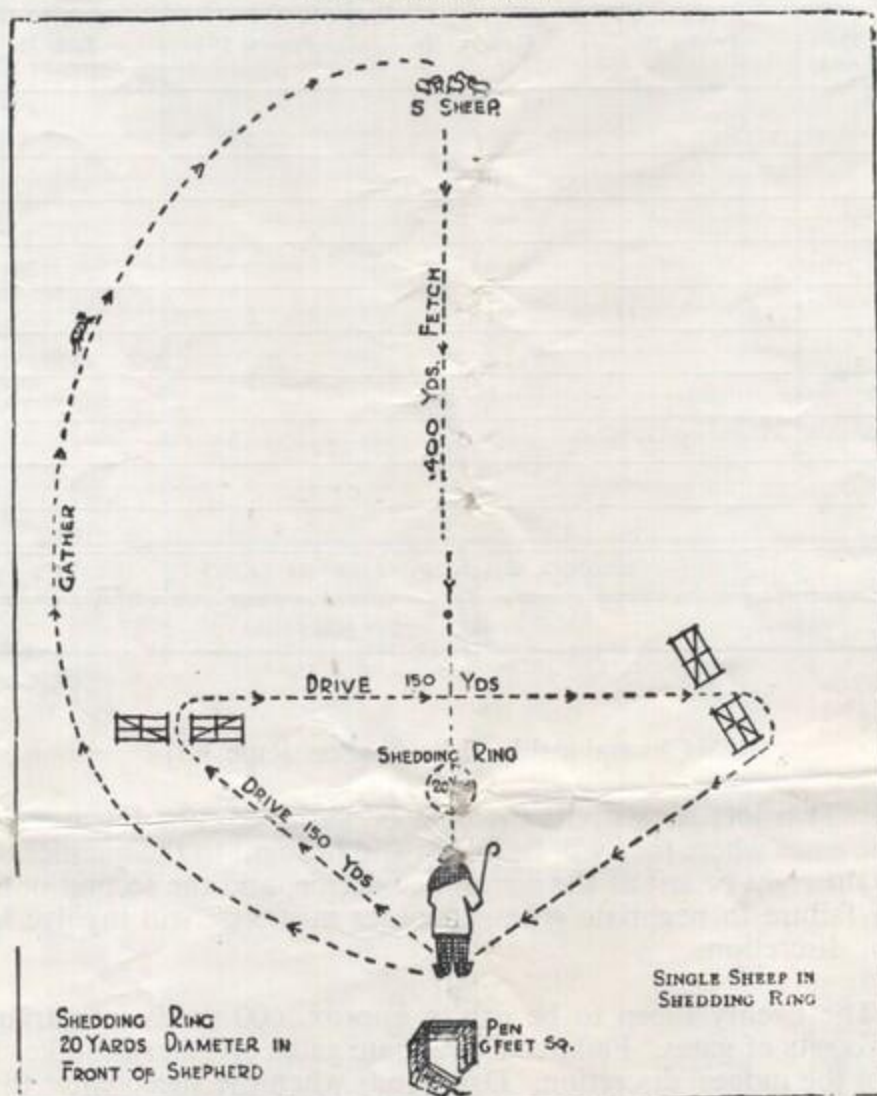

PRINT OF COURSE



Notes for Spectators:

1. **Gathering.** (Outrun, lift and fetch). Distance from shepherd to sheep, approx. 400 yards. In the outrun the dog may be directed on either side, and after "lifting" his sheep should bring them in a straight line to shepherd.
2. **Driving.** From shepherd approx. 450 yards in a triangular direction through two sets of gates. Drive ends at shedding ring.
3. **Shedding.** Two unmarked sheep within ring and dog to be in control of these sheep.
4. **Penning.** After shedding sheep to be gathered together and penned. Competitors are not allowed to assist dog in taking sheep to pen.
5. **Single.** One of the two marked sheep to be shed and held satisfactorily.

Failure to negotiate the gate obstacles and any other mistakes will involve a loss of points in the judges' discretion. Negotiation of the gates does not entitle a competitor to full points the primary consideration being the work as a whole. For details of points see page 7.

The Qualifying and Supreme Championship courses are designed to test a dog in all the aspects of work usually done on the hill. No stunts or tricks are included.

(Excerpt from Constitution)

"The objects of the Society shall be to stimulate public interest in the shepherd and his calling, secure the better management of stock by improving the shepherd's dog; give financial assistance to members (and their widows) in case of need. These objects shall be promoted by the holding of Trials, the institution of a Stud Book for sheep dogs, grants from the funds of the Society, and in any other way calculated to attain them."

NOTICES

1. Will any overseas visitors please contact the Secretary at his tent as soon as convenient.
2. Next year's (1960) National Trials will be held on sites not yet finally determined. The International Trial will be in England, probably in Lincolnshire.
3. Applications are invited from suitable places for future trials.
4. Members now being enrolled for 1960. Members receive free tickets for all the Society's trials and many other privileges. Annual membership £1. Life Membership £8 8s. Join NOW.
5. Members requiring copies of Stud Books should contact the Secretary at once as these are becoming scarce and will not be reprinted.
6. The attention of all members who breed dogs is particularly directed to the Stud Book rule which debar's any dog born after 1st January, 1959 and not recorded in a litter, from being registered. Failure to record all litters may have serious consequences.
7. Members are urged to attend their own "National" meeting whenever possible, and the importance of directors attending the Annual Meeting of directors cannot be too strongly stressed.
